

CLASS “A” (INDUSTRIAL) BURNING PERMIT CONDITIONS:

1. The permit holder shall be responsible for fires authorized by this permit and is solely responsible for damage or nuisance resulting from said fires and for the suppression of any escape or threatened escape of fire.
2. The following shall be provided at the site by the permit holder during light-up and until the fire is completely extinguished:
 - a) A competent person to be in charge of the fire and present at all times during the burn.
 - b) Sufficient appliances, equipment, water and labor to effectively maintain control over such fire and prevent the same from spreading, causing damage, or becoming dangerous to life or to other property.
3. The permit holder shall ensure that the material to be burned is a minimum of 100 metres from a neighbouring residence, 500 metres from a school in session, a hospice or extended care facility, 15 metres from a property line, 15 metres from standing timber, brush or other flammable material and not within 30 metres of any building or structure.
4. Burn piles are not to exceed 200 cubic metres in size.
5. The machine used to build the intended burn piles or its equivalent must remain on site at all times and the operator must remain available during the burn.
6. All burning is to cease during periods of high winds.
7. The permit holder shall totally extinguish all fires authorized by this permit on or prior to expiration of the permit or upon suspension or cancellation of the permit, or when instructed to do so by an officer of the Roberts Creek Volunteer Fire Department.
8. All burning is to conform to Ministry of Environment Open Burning Smoke Control Regulations (see attached information sheet) and the BC Environmental Management Act.
9. Burning to continue for a maximum of 96 hours.
10. The permit holder shall also abide by the following special conditions while acting under this permit: *To be determined at the time of inspection.*

The Roberts Creek Fire Department will not be responsible for patrolling the fire other than to extinguish any fire that threatens to get out of control or is depositing sparks on adjacent structures or other areas the department deems hazardous.

If the conditions of this permit are not adhered to any cost resulting from the extinguishment of said fire and/or investigation of complaints will be borne by the permit holder. Fire apparatus will be invoiced at \$400/hr/truck (1 hour minimum).
